Welcome to our first-ever annual report! We have much to celebrate this year, and we're happy to welcome you to the party.

Our 18th season began in the United Kingdom, with our first international tour that had been two years in the making. We sang at Great St. Mary's, the University Church in Cambridge; Bristol Cathedral; and Chepstow Castle as guests of the Chepstow Male Voice Choir. We competed at the International Musical Eisteddfod in Llangollen, Wales in the female choir and adult folk choir categories, placing third in the latter! Thanks to your generosity, every singer who needed financial assistance to participate in this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity received it.

We are well-known for our adventurous, thematic programming, and 2015-2016 was no exception. O Mother, Where Art Thou? opened our season in December, focused on the Virgin Mary, and featured Conrad Susa's "Carols and Lullabies: Christmas in the Southwest." March 2016 brought our audiences a collaboration with Bel Canto, the chamber choir of MenAlive: the Orange County Gay Men's Chorus, for American Anthems with Bernstein's "Chichester Psalms" as its centerpiece. We closed the season with Sound Bites, conducted by Assistant Director Sarah Hughes, featuring food, wine, and musical pairings.

We are led by an incredible artistic team, and a dedicated and talented Board of Directors who serve hundreds of hours as a working and governing board. We're excited about the ten-year and three-year visions and the strategic plan we developed and implemented this season, and can hardly wait to see its results as even now, we begin preparations for our 20th anniversary season. We are so grateful to our patrons and donors who make it possible for us to bring our music to life in this community. We are careful stewards of your investment in the Orange County Women's Chorus, and we hope you're pleased with all we've accomplished with the generous support you have provided.

Eliza Rubenstein, Artistic Director since 2000

Eliza Rubenstein studied choral conducting and English at Oberlin College before moving to southern California in 1995 to earn her master's degree in conducting from UC-Irvine. Besides her work with the OCWC, she is the Director of Choral and Vocal Activities and music-department chair at Orange Coast College, and the Artistic Director of the Long Beach Chorale and Chamber Orchestra. She serves on the board of the California chapter of the American Choral Directors' Association as the editor of Cantate magazine, and has conducted performances and presented seminars at ACDA regional and national conferences. Eliza is a former animal-shelter administrator and dog trainer, and the co-author of The Adoption Option: Choosing and Raising the Rescue Dog for You. In 2006 she presented a seminar entitled "Sit! Stay! Sing!: What Choral Conductors Can Learn from Dog Trainers" at the ACDA's Western regional conference. She shares her home with Dayton, a yellow lab, and Wilbur, a grey cat, and she's passionate about grammar, Thai food, photography, and the St. Louis Cardinals.



Sarah Hughes, Assistant Director since 2013

Sarah Hughes is a 2011 graduate of the Conservatory of Music at Chapman University in Orange. She holds a Bachelor of Music degree in music education with an emphasis in voice and recently completed her Master of Arts degree in teaching at Chapman University while teaching music in the Fountain Valley school district. Frequently invited to direct for high school summer choral camps, Sarah has taught styles ranging from Baroque classics to show choir pop arrangements. 
Jessica Cosley served as our 2015 - 2016 Conducting Intern

Where our money comes from

Only about 25% of our revenue is derived from our ticket sales. We rely on the generosity of our donors to bring our music to the community. 


2015-2016 Highlights:
